Prohibits a store from providing a single-use carryout bag to a customer unless the store charges a fee per bag at the point of sale. Exempts certain customers from paying the fee. Establishes the Bag Pollution Fund in the State Treasury and requires a store to remit the fees to the State Board of Equalization for deposit into the fund. Provides moneys in the fund would be expended as grants to cities and counties for programs related to carry-out bags and reusable bag giveaway programs.
