- Completed User Needs Assessment
- Refined Project Design
- Current Focus:
 - Website and Model Programming
 - Data Gathering & Management

Facility Inventory

- Consolidates different types of solid waste data at one website - one stop shopping
- Provides information on all disposal and recycling facilities - Board permitted and non-permitted
 - Name, location and contact info
 - Maximum capacity and total throughput in ranges
 - Diversion Rate
 - Materials handled input and output
 - Mapped layers (category, county summary, etc)
 - User searchable and downloadable data



- Projects waste disposal by county through 2025
- Allows evaluation of user-defined scenarios:
 - Redirect Future Disposal to Diversion by Material
 - Redirect Organics to New Fuel/Energy Facilities
 - Elimination of ADC
 - Collapse of Export Markets
- Outputs: Summary of flows and capacity needs & gaps
- Public website tool with limited functionality
 - County or Statewide Only; Limited Scenarios
- Board Staff Excel Model with Robust Functionality
 - Any County; Pre-Defined Regions or Statewide; All Scenarios



- Step 1: Start with CIWMB Data
- Step 2: Add External Published Sources
- Step 3: Consult Industry Professionals
- Step 4: Develop Preliminary Estimates for All Key Data Gaps
- Step 5: Up Load to Board Database
- Step 6: Facility Verification/Correction
- Step 7: Final QA/QC
