RE: ESJPA Grant Update

CalRecycle Used Oil Block Grants/Used Oil Payment Program

Funds for UBG 14 are spent and we using UBG 15 funds. The ESJPA will received funds under the Used Oil Payment (UOP) Program for Alpine, Colusa, and Mariposa Counties to assist with used oil and filter collections centers and education at the county fairs. Due to unspent UBG-15 funds, the ESJPA will not receive the UOP funds until April 2011. ESJPA Staff assisted with the Mariposa County fair held September 3rd through September 6th.

CalRecycle Household Hazardous Waste Grant (Butte, Colusa, Glenn)

We are continuing with implementation of HD17 (HHW with an emphasis on CFLs and medical sharps). Kiosks have been delivered to Butte County for distribution to Colusa and Glenn Counties. Orders have been placed for the sharps container, universal waste containers, and storage containers for Colusa and Glenn Counties. ESJPA met with our new grant manager Linda Dickinson and Cheryl Williams, her supervisor. A budget request was approved to simplify the grant budget and accommodate changes requested by the counties.

CalRecycle 2009/2010 Tire Amnesty Grants

The final report for the TCA-4 amnesty events for Butte, Colusa, Inyo, Mariposa, Nevada, Plumas, and Sierra has been submitted. A total of 497 tons of tires were collected. Preparations are underway to initiate preparations for the fall TCA-6 tire amnesty events for Mariposa, Nevada, Plumas, and Tuolumne.

USDA Solid Waste Grants

The USDA Solid Waste Grants application ends December 31, 2010. The ESJPA is considering submitting an application for conducting household hazardous waste and load checking trainings. Information on this grant program is available at:

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Solid Waste Management Grant Program

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Objectives:

The objectives of the Solid Waste Management Grant Program are to:

1. Reduce or eliminate pollution of water resources in rural areas; and
2. Improve planning and management of solid waste sites in rural areas.

NOTE: Rural areas are defined as any area not in a city or town with a population in excess of 10,000, according to the latest decennial census of the United States.

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Eligibility:

Entities eligible for Solid Waste Management (SWM) grants are:

1. Private nonprofit organizations with tax exempt status designated by the Internal Revenue Service. A nonprofit organization is defined as any corporation, trust, association, cooperative, or other organization that:
 - i. Is operated primarily for scientific, education, service, charitable, or similar purposes in the public interest.
 - ii. Is not organized primarily for profit.
 - iii. Uses its net proceeds to maintain, improve, and/or expand its operations.
2. Public bodies.
3. Federally acknowledged or State recognized Native American tribe or group.
4. Academic institutions.
