About Electronic Reporting

This page provides information on the Electronic Greenhouse Gas Reporting Tool (e-GGRT), a new web-based system EPA is developing to support reporting under the Greenhouse Gas Reporting Program (GHGRP). The e-GGRT registration module will be available in early fall 2010 in anticipation of reporting deadlines in 2011 (see below).

EPA is offering Webinar training sessions on the e-GGRT system. To register for a training session or view a static version of the training presentation, visit the Training Opportunities page.

EPA is designing e-GGRT to guide facilities and suppliers through registration and greenhouse gas (GHG) reporting using step-by-step web forms. Some reporters may choose to format their annual GHG report according to the e-GGRT Extensible Markup Language (XML) reporting schema and submit information via bulk file upload.

Certificate of Representation: January 30, 2011
 Annual GHG Report: March 31, 2011

Confidential Business Information (CBI)

EPA is currently promulgating a rule that will propose certain data elements reported under the GHGRP as Confidential Business Information (CBI). The rulemaking process, including notice and comment, is expected to be completed by early 2011 at which time EPA will publish a final list of CBI (and non-CBI) data elements collected under the GHGRP.
